

Lynnville Resident, Harvey A. Gause Succumbs Sunday

LYNNVILLE (Special) — Lynnville businessman Harvey A. Gause, 66, died Sunday morning at his home here following an illness of the past six weeks.

Mr. Gause had been associated in a hardware business here for the past 12 years.

Funeral services will be held at 2 p.m. Tuesday from the Hardin funeral home at New Sharon with the Rev. Peter Schuler officiating. Vocal music will be provided by Homer McDowell, accompanied by Mrs. Howard Macy.

At the time of his death he was a member of the Lynnville Town Council and the Masonic Lodge. He was a graduate of Lynnville high school and a veteran of World War I.
