Adrienne Gibson, 86, died Wednesday, Sept. 5, in her apartment at Pearson Hall, the Mayflower Home.

The body was cremated, and burial of the ashes will be in Elmhurst, Ill. A memorial service was conducted Saturday at the United Church of Christ-Congregational, with the Rev. David B. Bowman officiating.

The daughter of George W. and Adrienne Louise Caje Seeck, she was born Nov. 3, 1902, in Glasgow, Scotland. She and her parents emigrated from Scotland to the U.S. and lived in Pennsylvania, Ohio and Illinois before coming to Iowa.

She graduated from Lyons High School in Clinton in 1922, then attended the University of Iowa.

She was married to Floyd D. Gibson Aug. 2, 1924, in Sterling, Ill. Following their marriage, they lived in Chicago for six years, then moved to Villa Park, Ill., in 1930. Mrs. Gibson came to
