Edward M. Golden.

Edward Montgomery Golden, son of John F. and Elizabeth M. Golden, was born in Providence, Ill., April 22, 1858, and died at his home in this city, on Thursday, March 23. He came to Grinnell with his parents when eight years of age, and had lived in or near this city the most of the time until his death. He was united in marriage to Anna M.
