Mrs. Ellen Goodlow Dies In Montezuma

Ellen Beard, the daughter of John and Fanny Beard, was born in County Fermani, Ireland, on April 20, 1852, and died after a long illness at her home in Montezuma, Iowa, at 2:30 o'clock Friday afternoon, October 3, 1924, aged 72 years, 5 months, and 13 days. Of seven children she is the second to pass on to the better world. Those remaining are Mrs. R. C. Johnson of Deep River, Mrs. Frank Sackett of Brooklyn, Mrs. C. B.
