

Harold Goodman
Funeral services were held
at the Calvary Bible church,
North English, Jan. 31, for
Harold Franklin Goodman of
near Millersburg, who died
Jan. 28 at University hospital,
Ic. 1 City.

Pastors Russell George and Arthur Lang had charge of services and burial was in the Millersburg cemetery.

Harold Franklin Goodman was born August 25, 1918 near Millersburg in the farm home where he lived at the time of his death. He was the son of Perry A. and Agnes Kline Goodman. He attended the Millersburg school, graduating in 1935. He chose farming as his career and began on the home farm.

One June 27, 1942, he was married to Gayle Veit of Brooklyn. Three children were born to them: Gene, attending Faith Baptist Bible college, Ankeny; Donald, attending Area Ten Community College, and Mary Ellen, at home. The Goodmans celebrated their 25th wedding anniversary last year.

In January, 1943, he entered the U.S. Army and was a member of the First Convalescent Hospital unit for three years. He spent 15 months in the Phillippine Islands. In connection with his farming operation he operated a feed store in Millersburg from 1959 to 1965. He served on the County Extension Council from 1963 to 1967. For the past five years he and his wife were Young People's sponsors at the Calvary Bible church of which he was a member. At the time of his death he was vice moderator and financial secretary of the church.

He was preceded in death by his parents, his sister, Martha (Mrs. Carl Voelkel) and his brother, Everett, who died Dec. 20, 1967.

He is survived by his widow and three children, three sisters, Mrs. John Eisher of Cedar Rapids; Mrs. Russell Pope of North English; and Mrs. Ralph Keller of Marengo.
