Marion 'Doc' Goodrich

Funeral services were held Monday morning, Nov. 25, at the First Presbyterian Church in Brooklyn for Marion "Doc" Goodrich, 84, of Brooklyn, who died Friday morning, Nov. 22, 1996, in Grinnell Regional Medical Center in Grinnell.

He was a member of the American and Poweshiek County Angus Association. He was a salesman for McCurdy's Seeds for 50 years. For nine years, Doc was active in the 4-H. During the 1950s, he sponsored teen dances and taught and called square dancing. He sponsored trophies for the 4-H and FFA county fairs.

Goodrich was preceded in death by his wife, who died June 8, 1994; a son,

James, one brother, and two grandchildren.
