## Florence Goodwin | Services Tuesday

Mrs. Florence Smith Goodwin, 83, of Grinnell, died early Sunday morning at a local hospital following an extended illness.

Funeral services will be held at 9:30 a.m. Tuesday from the James-Schalinske Funeral Home with the Rev. Robert Dewey, pastor of the Congregational church. officiating. Graveside services and burial will be at the Burt, Iowa, cemetery.

The daughter of Lewis C. and Clara Richards Smith, she was born June 7th, 1879, at Cleveland, Ohio. She spent her childhood and young womanhood in Burt and Algona, Iowa, and graduated from Burt high school in 1896.

On Nov. 19th, 1907, she was united in marriage with James E. Goodwin of Burt. To this union were born four children: Mrs. Martin (Elizabeth) O'Connor and John S. Goodwin, both of Grinnell; James E. Goodwin, Jr., of Manchester: and Virginia, who died in childhood.
