Josephine C. Goodwin, 68, of 1318 West St. died of an apparent heart attack shortly after her admission to Mercy Medical Center in Des Moines Thursday.

Funeral services were conducted at 1 p.m. Tuesday at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. Daniel I. Ogata, pastor of the First United Presbyterian Church, officiating. Pallbearers were Frank Brown, Clarence Doud, Melvin Gauley, Arthur M. Heiman, Harold Jones and Jack Mathews. Fraternal rites were conducted by the Grinnell Rebekah Lodge No. 119. Burial was at Hazelwood Cemetery.

The daughter of Frederick George and Wilhelmina Mustapha Hanson, she was born Jan. 7, 1913, near Chelsea. She attended rural schools in Jefferson and Madison townships and Brooklyn High School.

She moved with her family to Brooklyn where she worked as a dental assistant until 1943, then worked at the Oakdale Sanitarium for a year, returning to Brooklyn where she was associated with the Brooklyn Mutual Telephone Co. for 15 years. She came to Grinnell in 1959 and worked for the Danish Maid Bakery and the Grinnell Taxi Co.

On Sept. 16, 1960, she was married to John Smith Goodwin in Grinnell. Mrs. Goodwin was a member of the Rebekah Lodge and the Grinnell First United Presbyterian Church. While in Brooklyn, she was a member of the Brooklyn Business Club.

Her husband preceded her in death in 1975. Also preceding her in death were her parents; four brothers, Charles, Albert, George and John Hanson; and a sister, Magalene Mae Johnston.
