civic work, having been a recipient of the Ford Motor Co. Citizen of the Year award for outstanding community service. She belonged to the Order of Eastern Star, Kappa Delta Beta, Grinnell College Women's Club, Iowa Council of Republican Women and the Hy-perion Field Club.
