

## Lora Goreham

### Rites Tuesday

Mrs. Lora V. Goreham, 78, died late Saturday, Oct. 6, at St. Francis Manor.

The daughter of James A. and Nancy Taylor Kline, she was born Sept. 14, 1895, near Grinnell. She attended rural schools in the Blue Point area and later was married to

Walter S. Goreham on Aug. 26, 1913, in Des Moines. The couple had three sons—W. Sinclair Goreham, who died in 1964; Lyle L. Goreham, who died in 1972; and Bryce L. Goreham who died at the age of 11 in 1931.

Following their marriage, Mr. and Mrs. Goreham farmed in the Blue Point area and later moved to a farm near Montezuma. In 1941 they moved to Grinnell, leaving in 1943 for Waterloo where Mr. Goreham was employed at the John Deere Co. until his retirement in 1963.

Mrs. Goreham had been associated with the Avon Products Co. while living in Waterloo. Mr. Goreham died Aug. 26, 1967. For the past two years, Mrs. Goreham had made her home in Grinnell.

Survivors include three grandchildren: Mrs. Darrell (Sherry) Argo of Marshalltown, Gary L. Goreham of Grinnell, and Mrs. Richard (Sue) Elliott of Grinnell; six great-grandchildren; a daughter-in-law, Mrs. Lyle L. (Ruth) Goreham; and two nieces, Mrs. Karl (Mary) Eker and Mrs. Leonard (Dorothy) Chase, both of Grinnell. She was preceded in death by her husband; her parents; her three sons; four brothers, William O. Kline, F.I. Kline, Mathew Kline, and Alba Kline; and a sister, Mrs. Lena Sheehy.
