Walter S. Goreham, Former Resident, Dies In Waterloo

Walter Sinclair Goreham, 50, died at his home in Waterloo Saturday evening. He had been in ill health for the past three years.

He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Walter Goreham, former Grinnell residents.

Funeral services are to be held at 10:30 a.m. Tuesday from the Parrott and Wood funeral home in Waterloo. Graveside services are to be conducted at 2:30 p.m. that same day at Lower Blue Point cemetery near Grinnell.

Funeral services were held Monday morning at the Parrot and Wood Chapel in Waterloo for Walter S. Goreham who died July 28 at St. Francis hospital.

The Rev. Kittenman conducted the services. Pallbearers were nephews of Mr. Goreham — Karl Eker, Leonard Chase, Lavene Kline, Keith Goreham, Wallace Dreinman and Harry Otto.

Burial was in the Blue Point cemetery.

Mr. Goreham was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Sherman Goreham of Waterloo. On Aug. 26, 1913 he married Lora Kline. To this union three sons were born — Clair, Lyle and Bryce. Clair and Bryce preceded him in death.

The couple farmed near Montezuma until 1941 when Mr. Goreham became an electrical welder and took a job at the John Deere Plant at Waterloo. He retired in 1963.

Survivors include his wife, Lora of Waterloo; one son, Lyle of Grinnell; three grandchildren; three great-grandchildren; and several nephews.
