Sarah A. Cowan was born in Pennsylvania February 20, 1830, and died at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Mary Wood, on March 20, 1912, aged 82 years and 1 month.

On the 14th of June, 1849, she was united in marriage to Edward Gorsuch. To this union were born 11 children, four of whom preceded her to the better world.

In 1851 she with her husband came West and settled near Browntown, where they lived for 20 years, and then moved to the neighborhood in which she died.

She united with the Methodist Episcopal church in early life, and took a deep interest in religious work. In discharging the duties and responsibilities of her daily life she sought the grace of Chirst, and found it all-sufficient. When passing through the deep waters of bereavement and sorrow she leaned upon the everlasting arms and put her trust in Him who has said, "I will never leave thee nor forsake thee."
