

## Berkley Gould

James Berkley Gould, 82, of 925 Seeland Dr., Grinnell, died Monday, Dec. 16, at Iowa Methodist Medical Center in Des Moines.

Funeral services were conducted at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday at the First Baptist Church, with the Rev. A. Cliff Bevins officiating. Organist was Alice Renaud, and vocalist was Marvin E. Kelley.
