Edmund I. Green, 90, of Grinnell died Thursday, May 22, at Friendship Manor.

A graveside service was scheduled for 10:30 a.m. Tuesday at Prairie View Cemetery, Gilman, with the Smith Funeral Home of Grinnell in charge of arrangements.

The son of Ira and Alice Langton Green, he was born April 30, 1907, in Gilman, where he was raised and was a 1925 graduate of Gilman High School.

He was married to Minnie Bell March 13, 1933, in Unionville, Mo., and the couple farmed in the Gilman area until 1941, then moved to Grinnell.
