Rites held Tuesday for Wayne I. Green

Funeral services were held at 1:30 p.m. on Tuesday, June 13, for Wayne I. Green, 42, of Grinnell, who was killed instantly late Saturday afternoon in a motorcycle accident.

Wayne Green, the son of Edmund I. and Minnie Maxine Bell Green, was born in Grinnell on Aug. 22, 1933. He attended the Gilman and Grinnell schools, and later enlisted in the United States Navy, serving over 20 years during the Korean and Viet Nam conflicts. Following his discharge, he worked for the Gilman Co-Op and for Grinnell General Hospital, and for the past few months he was employed at Manatt's Transportation.

He is survived by two sons: Douglas and Eddie Green; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Edmund I. Green of Brownsville, Tex.; three sisters, Mrs. Archie (Maxine) Jones of Monroe, Mrs. Harold (Beverly) Moyer of Grinnell, and Mrs. Richard (Alice) Shuler of Gilman; and a brother, John Green of Grinnell. Also surviving are a number of uncles, aunts, nieces and nephews. He was preceded in death by a son, Randy Allen Green, in infancy.

Officiating at the funeral services, held in the Smith Funeral Home, was the Rev. Hugh A. Shiveley, pastor of the First Baptist Church. Organist was Mrs. Sue Martindale, and vocalist was Mrs. Carol Hall. Pallbearers were Aaron C. Crobin, Keith Garwood, Ron Moyer, Ed Patten, Mike Shuler, and Hollis Sisco.

Burial was in the Prairie View Cemetery, with graveside rites conducted by Harmon Anderson, Commander, and members of the Paul Ward Post No. 149 of the Gilman American Legion.
