John Edgar Gregson, son of Jackson and Nancy Gregson, was born Sept. 25 1863, and departed this life Dec. 3, 1925 at his home at 315 Sixth Ave., Grinnell, at the age of 62 years, 2 months and 8 days.

While suffering the severest pain during the last six weeks of his sickness he was always patient, and so thankful for all that was done for him, after saying that there was so much done to make him comfortable. He was never feeling too bad to welcome his relatives and friends who came to see him.

Short funeral services were held at the home Saturday, Dec. 5, at 10:30 o'clock A. M., conducted by Rev. E. M. Gregson of Eldon. Ia. The funeral services were to be held at Ewart Saturday afternoon at one o'clock but on account of the roads being impassible the services at Ewart were postponed until Monday afternoon at one o'clock, conducted by Rev. E. M. Gregson assisted by Rev. E. W. Gregson of Ewart, Burial was in the Ewart Cemetery.
