John Guddendorf, 81, of Brooklyn died at his home Monday, Dec. 14.

Funeral services were conducted Wednesday at the Nevenhoven Funeral Home, with the Rev. Fr. Joe Rogers, pastor of St. Patrick's Catholic Church, officiating.
