

Hold Funeral Rites Today For Katherine Haag

Funeral services for Katherine Marie Haag, who died Feb. 4 at a local hospital, were held this afternoon (Thursday) from the James-Schalinske Funeral Home with the Rev. Leland Mann officiating.

Organ music at the service was provided by Mrs. Kathleen Heffner. Interment was at the Golden Rod cemetery at Deep River.

The daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Haag, she was born in Iowa county about five miles southeast of Guernsey, on Jan. 24, 1879. With her parents she moved to Deep River in 1902. In 1905, she went to California to work and made her home there with an aunt.

In 1912, Miss Haag came to Grinnell to make her home with her parents, who had moved from their farm in 1909. She was employed at a local ready-to-wear store for many years. A fall on the ice in 1941 fractured her leg and since that time she continued to do sewing in her home.

During those years, she was active in the Methodist church where she was a member. She was a member of the Eastern Star and a charter member of the American Legion Auxiliary and Community Hospital Auxiliary. Miss Haag was also a member of the Business Women's Fellowship Club.

Preceding her in death were her parents, two sisters, Emma-line and Elizabeth, and a brother, William.

Surviving are her sisters, Mrs. Carrie Cranston, Mrs. Lydia Elliott and Mrs. Lenora Keller of Deep River, Pearl of Grinnell, and a brother Orrie of Grinnell. Several cousins, nieces and nephews also survive.
