Complications following surgery claimed the life of Mrs. Pearl Hall, 71, last Friday evening at University Hospitals in Iowa City where she had been admitted the first of last week. She had undergone surgery Wednesday morning.

Funeral services were conducted Monday afternoon at two o'clock at Bramer Funeral Home with George W. Roquet, pastor of First United Presbyterian church, of-ficiating. Mrs. Ed Bartachek

Pearl May, daughter of John L. Montgomery and Eva Caruth Montgomery, was born April 26, 1893, at Aurora, III. and died August 21, 1964 in Iowa City. When she was about twelve years old, she moved with her family to the Brooklyn community where she had lived the remainder of her life.

She was married to John Leroy (Roy) Hall of Brooklyn in November, 1912, and the couple farmed south of Brooklyn for many years. In 1952, a year following her husband's

death, Mrs. Hall moved into Brooklyn where she lived ever since at 216 Clay street.

Mrs. Hall was a member of the First United Presbyterian church, the Order of Eastern Star and Rebekah lodge. She was also a charter member of the Social Circle Club in which she had maintained an active

membership.

Mrs. Hall is survived by three sons and one daughter. They are Melvin Hall of Waterloo, Richard Hall of Cedar Falls, Lloyd Hall of Brooklyn and Mrs. Gerald (Evelyn) Hall of Brooklyn. She also leaves 11 grandchildren, four great-grandchildren and a half-brother, George Montgomery of Victor.

She was preceded in death by her husband in 1951; a son, Daryl, who lost his life at the age of 21 during World War II at Normandy, France on June 12, 1944; a brother, Alva Montgomery; her parents and her step-mother.
