Mr. Halstead services set

Edwin M. Halstead, 51, of Little Rock, Ark., died sudden of an apparent heart attack at his home Saturday, May 5, 1977.

Funeral services will be held at 1:30 p.m. Saturday at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. James Russell, pastor of the Grinnell United Methodist Church, officiating. Organist will be Kathleen Heffner. Graveside services will be held at 3:30 p.m. at Glendale Cemetery in Des Moines. Friends may call at the Smith Funeral Home after 9 a.m. Friday.

The son of Leonard and Anna Larsen Halstead, he was born May 21, 1925, at Grinnell. He attended school here, graduating from Grinnell High School in 1944. He served with

the U.S. Marine Corps during World War II.

On July 21, 1947, he was married to Ruth Moore in Missouri. Following their marriage, they lived in Grinnell where he worked with the Smith Funeral Home. The couple later moved to Des Moines where Mr. Halstead was employed by the Dictaphone Corp. for 12 years. They had lived in Little Rock for the past 5½ years.
