## Glen Halstead Dies In Calif.

Glen Halstead, 65, died Friday in Fullerton, Calif., following a sudden illness.

Mr. Halstead was spending the winter in California, but had made his home in Grinnell for about a year with his sister-in-law, Mrs. Len Halstead, Sr.

Graveside services for Mr. Halstead will be held at Hazelwood cemetery Thursday at 1:30 p.m. Dr. G. S. Bruland, pastor of the Methodist church, will officiate. Friends may call at the Smith Funeral Home Wednesday evening.

He was the son of Alonzo and Ida Cooper Halstead and was born in Coal Creek, Iowa, on Mar. 14th, 1895. Later the family moved to Grinnell and he attended the local public schools and a business college in Des Moines.

He served in the Army during World War I and then lived in Chicago, Ill., for many years. Following his retirement he had been living in Grinnell.

Mr. Halstead is survived by a daughter, Mrs. Duane Miller of Waterloo, and one grandson. Also surviving are one brother, Raymond of Santa Barbara, Calif.; and four sisters, Mrs. Eva Fisher of Hedrick, Mrs. Pearl Schultz of Oskaloosa, Mrs. Mildred Lutes of Laurel, and Mrs. Gladys Pollard of Lincoln, Nebr.

He was preceded in death by his parents, one brother, and one sister.
