Halverson died on Tuesday,

Halverson was a brother-inlaw of Harold Macy of Lynnville, Mrs. Kelly Davis of Montezuma, and R.A. Ratcliff of Grinnell. Born July 18, 1889 in Wisconsin, he homesteaded in Montana and married Irene Ratcliff, who was born and raised in the Sugar Creek leighborhood, in October, 1916, at Oskaloosa.

At one time a school teacher, he established the Hub Supply Company at Lone Pine, Mont. It included a freezer locker plant, a large warehouse, a meat department, a garage business, a gasoline outlet, and a farm machinery and truck dealership.

He served as a western director of the Montana Seed Growers Association for 30 years, and as president of the board for 28 years. In 1959, he received a service award from the International Crop Improvement Association in Clemson, S.C. He retired and moved to California in 1962.
