

Hamilton rites held Wednesday

Jane Hamilton died Sunday morning, June 19, at Grinnell General Hospital following a brief illness.

Funeral services for Mrs. F. Jane Hamilton were held at 2 p.m. on Wednesday, June 22, at the Ewart United Presbyterian Church, with the Rev. Danial Ogata, minister of the First United Presbyterian Church in Grinnell, and the Rev. Martin Gruneich, minister of the Ewart church, officiating. Organist for the service was Rebecca Arnaman and vocalist was Linda Stout.
