Miss Martha Findigy Hannay was born in Carsphairn, Scotland on March 15th, 1864, the daughter of John Findley and Margaret Rankine Hannay, and departed this life for her eternal rest Monday morning, August 31, 1959 at a Grinnell nursing home where she had been a resident the past four years. She was 95 years of age.

In the fall of 1383, when she was 19 years old, the family left Scotland for America and settled at Davenport, Iowa. They moved to Grinnell in 1867 and in 1890 they settled on the family farm home northeast of Grinell. There she made her home until 1926 when she moved to Grinnell.

Miss Hannay had lived in the Grinnell area for the last 72 years.

Miss Hannay was a member of the Calvary Baptist church in Grinnell and was a faithful and active member until her health made it impossible for her to attend. Her life was devoted to her Savior, her Bible, her church and her loved ones.
