

## Mr. Harders rites today

Marcus E. Harders, 57, of 95 Fourth Ave. died Wednesday evening at his home of an apparent heart attack. *Nov. 14*

Funeral services for Mr. Harders are scheduled for 1 p.m. today at the Smith Funeral Home, with the Rev. Marcus E. Reitz, pastor of St. John's Lutheran Church, officiating. Burial will be at the Union Cemetery, Newton.
