Allison M. Harrington was born at Manlius, Bureau Co., Ill., February 27, 1857. Two years later his parents moved to Williamstown, Vt., and eight years afterward came to Illinois where they remained until about eighteen months later, when they became residents of Iowa, where they have since lived. Since 1872 Grinnell has been the family home. For the last eleven years business has taken Mr. Harrington from home for a larger part of the time, much of which he spent in the employ of the Spaulding Manufacturing Co. as a faithful, efficient and successful worker.

He was married June 29, 1901, to Miss Annie Newton, who has always accompanied film in his travels.

In February, 1901, he became a member of the Methodist Episcopal Chu, and has maintained, without reproadand with much efficiency and faithfulness, his church relation.

Four weeks ago, apparently recovering from an attack of malarial fever, he returned to his home in Grinnell, where, on Tuesday, July 28, he died.

Mr. Harrington was a kind, devoted husband,—perfectly happy in his marriage relation,—a tender, and affectionate brother and a son of whom his mother testifies, he never gave her a heart ache.

Funeral services were conducted by his pastor, Dr. Walter P. Stoddard, from the residence of his parents, Thursday, July 30, 1903.
