## Louis A. Hasselbrink

Louis Albert Hasselbrink, 85, of Newton, who until three years ago had lived his entire life in Kellogg, died Saturday. Oct. 3. at Skiff Medical Center in Newton of complications following several strokes.

Funeral services were conducted Tuesday at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church, with the Rev. Jerome Egel officiating. Burial was in Our Silent City Cemetery, Kellogg, with the Wallace-Pence Funeral Home of Newton in charge of arrangements.

He was the son of Christoph and Amelia Schultz Hasselbrink and was born Nov. 1, 1906, on a farm west of Laurel. He was a 1924 graduate of Kellogg High School. He was married to Edna Badger March 1, 1930,

son, Roger of Cedar Rapids; one daughter, Joan Mason of Newton; four grandchildren; two great-grandchildren; and one sister, Elsie Reed of Grinnell. He was preceded in death by five brothers, two sisters and two half-brothers.
