A. Hauersperger Rites Wednesday

Funeral services for Adam N. Hauersperger, 89, a former Kellogg resident, have been set for 10 a.m. Wednesday. Hauersperger, who died Sunday evening in a Grinnell nursing home, had been in failing health.

The son of Nicholas and Maghalena Gerringer Hauersperger, he was born May 5, 1880 in Hayden, Ind. As a young man, he moved to the Brooklyn area, where he married Elizabeth Christina Kriegel on Oct. 9, 1906. To this union were born eight children, seven of whom survive. They include: Edward of Kellogg; Mrs. Russell (Margaret) Shank of Kellogg; Henry of rural Gilman; Mrs. Charles (Ethyl) Holderness of Newton; Mrs. Issacc (Anna) Brown of Kellogg; Sylvester of Newton; and Lloyd of rural Kellogg.

To Indiana

Following their marriage, Mr. and Mrs. Hauersperger moved to Indiana for a few years. Later they returned to Iowa, where they farmed, first north of Brooklyn, and later in Marshall and Jasper Counties.

Adam Hauersperger was preceded in death by his wife on Dec. 5, 1942. Also preceding him in death were one son, Floyd Raymond Hauersperger, in April 1955; one great granddaughter; two brothers, Albert and Joe; and one sister, Mrs. Matilda Haag.

He is survived by seven children, 17 grandchildren, and 24 great-grandchildren. Also surviving are a brother, Ambrose, of Seymour, Ind., and a sister, Mrs. Anna Burgmeier of North Vernon, Ind.

Presiding at the funeral services will be the Rev. Leo V. Kubrich, pastor of St. Mary's Catholic Church. Burial will be in the Calvary Cemetery in Brooklyn.
