killed in crash

Margaret Elizabeth Haunsperger, 56, of Rte. 2, Kellogg, was killed Monday when the car she was driving collided with a semi-trailer truck at a Newton intersection. Authorities said the truck, driven by Roger Stuart, 31, of New Town, Conn., failed to stop at a stop sign. Charges were pending against Stuart.

Mrs. Haunsperger's daughter, Deanna, 12, was taken to Iowa Methodist Medical Center in Des Moines where she was listed in serious condition Tuesday.

Funeral services for Mrs. Haunsperger were set for 2 p.m. Thursday at the Johnson-Reese Chapel in Newton, with the Rev. Carl Klein, pastor of the Kellogg United Methodist Church, officiating. Burial will be at Our Silent City Cemetery, Kellogg.

Lillian Armstrong, she was born Jan. 6, 1921, in Grinnell. She attended school here. On Oct. 17, 1953, she was married to Albert T. Haunsperger in Grinnell. The couple then moved to Kellogg.

Prior to her marriage, she had worked in the office of Grinnell Junior High School. For the past 12 years, she worked in the Kellogg elementary school system, lately as librarian. She was a member of the Kellogg United Methodist Church.

Mrs. Haunsperger is survived by her husband; three sons, Blaine A. of Newton and Blair A. and Jeffery R., both of the family home in Kellogg; her daughter, Deanna; and a brother, Everett Armstrong of Grinnell.

She was preceded in death by her parents and a brother.
