

## OBITUARY

Mae Estella Wilkinson Haworth, daughter of William and Sarah Wilkinson, was born at Chelsea, Iowa, on January 1, 1876, and passed away after an extended illness at St. Francis hospital, Grinnell, Iowa, on Feb. 5, 1958, at the age of 82 years.

She attended the rural schools near Chelsea and was graduated from Toledo high school. Following high school she taught in the rural schools of Tama county for two years.

On June 24, 1896, she was united in marriage to Charles LeRoy Haworth. The first year after their marriage they operated a restaurant at Toledo, and then farmed in Tama county until 1909, when they moved to a farm near New Sharon. For the next 36 years they farmed in Mahaska and Poweshiek counties. In 1946 they retired and moved to Montezuma.

Mrs. Haworth was a longtime member of the Montezuma Methodist church, and a faithful worker in the organizations of the church as long as her health permitted.

She was preceded in death by her husband and one daughter, Amber Lucille, who died in infancy. She is survived by three sons: Donald, East Lansing, Mich.; Kenneth, Montezuma; and Burnell, Mount Pleasant; one sister, Reba Ainslie of Los Angeles, Calif.; eight grandchildren; one grandson; and many friends.

Final rites were held at the Montezuma Methodist church, conducted by the Rev. George S. Snyder, pastor, on Saturday, Feb. 8, 1958, at 2 p.m. Burial was in Jackson township cemetery.
