Margaret A. Hay, 87, of Newton, a native of rural Kellogg, died of heart failure Wednesday, May 22, at Skiff Medical Center in Newton.

Funeral services were conducted Saturday at the Wallace-Pence Funeral Home in Newton, with the Rev. Nolan Kelsey officiating. Burial was in Newton memorial Park Cemetery.
