F.G. Hayes rites tomorrow

Forst Gayle Hayes of San Antonio, Tex., died early Sunday, March 21 at the Nix Hospital in San Antonio. He was 68.

Graveside services for Forst Gayle Hayes will be held Friday, March 26 at the Hazelwood Cemetery. The Rev. John C. Epperson, pastor of the Grinnell Christian Church, will officiate. Burial will be in Hazelwood Cemetery.

Forst Gayle Hayes was born to Alvah and Josephine Cooper Hayes on August 26, 1907 in Des Moines. He attended Des Moines public schools and graduated from East High School. He worked for the Des Moines Register sports department until 1946.

Hayes married Edna B. Squire in Waukee, Iowa, on May 19, 1929. The couple had two sons. During World War II, Hayes served in the United States Navy.
