Mrs. Hays was a member of the United Church of Christ-Congregational and the Women's Fellowship of the church. She was a charter member of the Sonora Grange and the Grinnell Historical Society. She had held several offices in her church and the Grange.

Mrs. Hays is survived by her husband Max; her daughter Allene: two grandchildren, Laurie Ann and Steven Hays Brobst: and her brother, Charles J. Haynes of Omaha, Neb. She was preceded in death by her parents and her son.
