Adam Height, 75, Dead

Adam Height, 75, of Montezuma, died Tuesday morning at his home.

Born June 29, 1891, in Deep River, he was a life long resident of this community. Mr. Height was a contractor and a brick mason, and for the past 20 years had served as district supervisor for Moes Seed Company.

Surviving are his wife, the former Lucille Jordan; one daughter, Mrs. Marna Shinn of Cedar Rapids; two grandchildren, three sisters and one brother.

Funeral services were held at 2 p.m. Thursday at Steffy Funeral Home with the Rev. Howard Hays in charge and burial was in Jackson township cemetery.

Adam Height Funeral Services Held Thursday

Funeral services for a well known Montezuma man, Adam Height, were held at 2 p.m. Thursday, Jan. 5, at the Steffy Funeral Home with the Rev. Howard Hayes officiating. Music at the services was provided by Miss Alice Underwood, organist.

Interment was in Jackson Township Cemetery with F. R. Brownell, Kenneth Cox, E. W. McNeil, Harold Lofgreen, Melvin Elliott and Glenn Ross as casket bearers.

Adam, son of George and Sarah Height, was born in Deep River on June 26, 1891,

and died at his home in Montezuma Tuesday, Jan. 3. He was 75-years-old.

In his youth he attended the Deep River School and became a member of the Christian Church.

Later, he worked in Cedar Rapids where he was united in marriage with Ethel Johnson. To this union one daughter was born.

During World War I he served with the Armed Forces.

On May 19, 1918, he married Lucille Jordan. They have made their home in Montezuma for nearly 49

years.

Adam was a contractor and brick mason. For the past 21 years he has been a representative of the Moews Seed Corn Company.

He was a member of the Blakley-Stevens American Legion Post and the World War I Barracks.

He is survived by his wife; one daughter, Marna Shinn, Cedar Rapids; two grandchildren; three sisters, Pearl Elliott, Deep River; Harriet Knox, Bimidji, Minn.; and Gayle Watt, Bremerton, Wash.; and one brother, Henry Height, Clinton.
