

EARLY RESIDENT DIES

Funeral of Clint Heishman, Old Timer
In Sheridan, Held Sat-
urday.

HAD LIVED AN ACTIVE
AND EARNEST LIFE

Large Attendance of Sympathizing
Friends Attest Esteem Held for
Deceased.

Elmer Clinton Heishman was born near Muncie, Ind., April 27, 1870, and died Wednesday morning, December 28, 1921, at his home in Grinnell, aged fifty-one years, eight months and one day. He was the second son of Philip and Maggie Heishman, in a family of ten children, eight brothers, Andy J., William, John, Gus, Ernie, Earl, deceased, Clifford, Elzy, Lester and one sister, Alice Boyle, who died in 1916.

On September 30, 1891, he was married to Grace M. Bolen of Sheridan township. To this union were born three children—two sons, Forrest, who lives near Malcom, and Raymond who lives near Grinnell, and one daughter, Darlene, who died in infancy. Mr. and Mrs. Heishman managed his farms until about fifteen years ago when they moved to Grinnell. Along with his farming interests he was considered one of the best stock feeders and buyers in this section.

In September, 1913, he was operated on for brain tumor which was followed by paralysis. During his long illness when he was compelled to give up active duty, he has been a constant and welcome visitor among the friends he had formed in the days of his strength where his cheery smile and cordial greeting accorded him such a welcome as is given only to those who have won it by long helpfulness and sympathy.
