Gerrit Heitink Dies Monday; Funeral Today

Gerrit M. Heitink, 71. of Grinnell passed away Monday evening at the Veterans hospital at Iowa City following an extended illness.

Funeral services for Heitink were held this afternoon (Thursday) at the James-Schalinske Funeral Home with the Rev. Laverne Streich, pastor of St. John's Lutheran church, officiating.
