Death Calls For Mrs. Jens Hendrickson

Death came quietly to Mrs. Jens Hendrickson at the family home in Madison township at 8 a. m. Monday. July 15, 1935. Since a paralytic stroke six years ago she had been in failing health and was confined to her bed the last 32 months of her life.
