The daughter of Newton J. and Addie Riggs Darland, she was born near Union Mills in Mahaska County on July 3, 1892. She attended schools in the Union Mills area and belonged to the Union Mills Church of Christ. She was a clerk at a store in Barnes City before her marriage.

On Dec. 25, 1909, she was married to Clarence E. Hicks. They farmed in the Beulah community for many years. In 1941 they moved to Montezuma where she operated the

Cottage Cafe. After Mr. Hicks' death in 1958 she cared for ill and elderly persons in her home. She also was a cook at a fraternity house at Iowa City, at a girls home in Cedar Rapids and at a camp in Wisconsin. She was a member of the First Church of Christ Disciples, the Beulah Club and the Garden Club.
