Eldon Pearce, Howard Hill Are Victims; Four Others Are Hospitalized

Two area youths were killed and four others injured as the result of a two-ear headon crash one mile east of Gilman on Highway 146 about 10:30 p.m. Friday.

Killed instantly were Eldon G. Pearge, 19, of Malcom, and Howard D. Hill, 21, of Gilman. Injured and hospitalized were Dean Kriegel, 19, Malcom: Bob Weitzel, 24, Malcom; Roger Peters, 18, Grinnell, and Gene Daugherty, 19, Gilman, The injured youths were all rushed to Grinnell hospitals and on Saturday Weitzell was transferred to Iowa City for further treatment.

Both cars were completely demolished. Leuder indicated that no charges were filed immediately but that there was a possibility that certain charges might be made following a complete investigation.
