Mrs. L. H. Hinrichs, maiden name, Anna Maria Schultz, was born Aug. 17, 1881 in Hartford township, Iowa county. Her parents were W. F. Schultz and Wilhelmina Poeper Schultz.

She was baptized in St. John's Lutheran church, Lincoln township, and received her early education in the congregation's-Christian day school. She was confirmed with the class of Mar. 29, 1896, by pastor O. Kitzman.

Mrs. Hinrichs attended high school in Deep River, and after a normal training course, taught in the rural schools a number of years.

On Jan. 16, 1901, she was united in holy wedlock with L. H. Hinrichs. The couple made their home in Lincoln township near Guernsey. Here they lived for 44 years before they moved to Marengo. In the later years Mrs. Hinrichs was taken care of by some of their children, and also in the Lutheran home for the aged at Vinton, and in a nursing home in Belle Plaine where she

died Jan. 30, at the age of 81 years, 5 months, 13 days.
