Carl L. Hogendorn, 76, contributing editor and retired owner-publisher of the North English Record, died Sunday, Dec. 7, 1986, at Mercy Hospital, Iowa City, of a heart ailment.

He was born Dec. 24, 1909, at Colfax. He married Bertilla Driscoll in 1936 at Williamsburg. He worked at newspapers in Strawberry Point, Colfax, Grundy Center and Wellsburg before coming to North English in 1933. He became owner of the North English Record in 1955. In 1946 he helped organize the Press Columnists of Iowa and served as its first president.

He was named master editor-publisher in 1962 by the then Iowa Press Association.

He was the first president of the Iowa County Historical Society, organized the Iowa State Midget Baseball Association in 1950 and served as its first secretary-treasurer. He received the "Most Worthy Citizen" award from the Oskaloosa Chamber of Commerce in 1950, named outstanding senior citizen for Iowa County in 1981.

Surviving are three sons: Terry of North English, David of Waukon and Lenny of Toledo; seven daughters, Jo Rae Pieffer of Fairfield, Marsha Raitt of Iowa City, Denise Naughton of Waterloo, Leslie Slaubaugh of Wellman, Honore Johnston of Davenport, Kris Berg of Iowa City and April Rouner of Iowa City; three brothers, David of Des Moines, Paul of Oskaloosa and Frank of Walnut Creek, Calif.; three sisters, Ruth Palmer, Myrtle Robuck and Lucille Stiles, all of Des Moines; 28 grandchildren and one great-grandchild.

Services were set for 10 a.m. Wednesday at St. Joseph's Catholic church with burial in North English Cemetery.
