

W.L. Holley Rites Conducted April 27

Funeral services for William L. Holley, 80, were conducted Wednesday, April 27, at 10:30 a.m. at Bramer Funeral Home with the Rev. George W. Roquet, pastor of the First United Presbyterian Church, officiating. Mrs. Ed Bartachek was organist.

He was married Oct. 11, 1912, to Lois Corrough who preceded him in death in August, 1932.

On June 22, 1935, he was married to Myrtle Torrance, who survives.

Mr. Holley had lived on the same farm west of Brooklyn for 75 years, until 1960 when he and his wife retired and moved into Brooklyn.

He was a member of the Presbyterian Church. He was also a member of the I.O.O.F. and Rebekah Lodges for more than 50 years.

He was preceded in death by two brothers and two sisters: Emory Holley, Earl Holley, Mrs. Maud Corrough and May Holley, the latter dying in infancy.
