Mrs. Sarah Elizabeth Holmes Dies In Lynnville

Sarah Elizabeth Butrum was born in Greenwich county, Kentucky, January 29, 1842, and departed this life in Lynnville, Iowa, June 10, 1935, at the age of ninety-three years, four months and eleven days.

In 1854 or soon after, she, with her parents, William E. and Elizabeth Butrum, moved to Iowa. This marked the beginning of her long residence in this state, where in Lynnville in 1873 and in 1876 respectively, her mother and father passed away.

On January 29, 1860, she was married to Loammi Moore; then after twelve short years, death claimed him. To this union were born seven children, three of whom died in infancy; Israel A. at the age of one year and six months; Clara E. Moore Bricky in 1905; Charles L. Moore in 1932 at the age of sixty; and Rosa B. Moore Wright on January, 1934, aged 66 years.

In 1876 she was married to Isaac Holmes and with the exception of eight year spent in New Sharon and Forest Home, Iowa, she has made her home in Lynnville, where in 1915 she was again bereft of her companion.

She is survived by two sisters, Mrs. Amanda J. Burton of Omaha, Neb., and Mrs. Emma Youngkin Carter of Miami, Florida; also by a number of grandchildren and great grandchildren, nieces and nephews and the descendants of Isaac Holmes by a former marriage.

Funeral services were held from the Friends church Thursday afternoon with Rev. Blanche Conover in charge. Singers were Mrs. Will Allee, Mrs. Harvey Gause, A. T. Gifford and Charlie Potter, with Mrs. A. T. Gifford at the piano. Songs sung were "Old Rugged Cross." "Rock of Ages" and "Asleep in Jesus."

Honorary pallbearers were C. F. Briggs, Elias Allee, Mike Kuntz, J. V. Kline. William Zimmerman and John Lawrence.
