

Mrs. Holstrom, 92, Dies At Newton

Mrs. Anna Holstrom, 92, a former Brooklyn resident for more than 50 years, died Sunday afternoon in Newton at the home of her daughter, Marie, with whom she had made her home for the past ten years.

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at two o'clock at Bramer's funeral home in charge of the Rev. G. H. Hulsebus, pastor of First United Presbyterian church. Organist was Mrs. Ed Bartachek. Burial was in I.O.O.F. cemetery with the following serving as pallbearers: Dr. Joseph E. Prior, Thomas H. Ryder, Donald Holstrom, Dale Holstrom, Elver Miller and Harold Carlson. In charge of flowers were Gertrude Newkirk, Mr. and Mrs. Cliff Williamson, Mr. and Mrs. Thomas Leirmo and Mrs. Eugene Bush.

Anna Mathilda Carlson, daughter of John and Sarah Carlson, was born at Asled, Sweden, Sept. 10, 1867. She came to America at the age of 24 and came directly to Brooklyn, where she lived a year in the home of her uncle, Claus Carlson.

In 1892 she was married to Frank O. Holstrom of Chicago, Ill., and nine children were born to the couple. In 1897 the family moved to Brooklyn. At one time Mrs. Holstrom and all of her children belonged to the Presbyterian church in Brooklyn.

Mrs. Holstrom is survived by four sons and three daughters. They are: Arthur of Davenport, Harry of Omaha, Neb., Fred of Jewell, Carl of Short Hills, N. J., Mrs. Anna Rogers of Olympia, Wash., Mrs. Ruth Koons of Des Moines, and Mrs. Marie Halterman of Newton. She also leaves one brother, Enoch Carlson, of Emmetsburg; two sisters, living in Sweden; ten grandchildren and 22 great-grandchildren.

Preceding her in death were her husband, in 1930; a daughter, Agnes, who died at the age of three; and a son, Wade, in 1937.
