**Professor Charles H. Horn.**

A telegram received on Tuesday brought the unexpected news of the death of Professor Charles H. Horn, former principal of the Iowa College Academy, at his farm home near Lowell, Mich. The announcement brought sorrow to a great many friends in Grinnell, for Professor Horn endeared himself to many during his years of residence here. One son, John, who has been employed in the Merchants National bank, left at once for Lowell. Professor Horn's connection with the college closed four years ago, with the decision to abandon the academy. Another place on the faculty was made for him, but he declined it and accepted a position as principal of the academy of Parsons college at Fairfield. This position, however, he was unable to fill on account of failing health. After a year of rest he went on a farm at Lowell and from this time on reports of his continued improvement had brought pleasure to Grinnell friends. No particulars are known as yet, but it is presumed that death came suddenly, as the news came entirely without warning.

The funeral was held yesterday at Olivet, Mich.
