Joseph Horn Passes 8-3 Away At Newton

He served as Cashier of the new Jasper County Savings Bank until it was later sold. He then engaged in business and yet retained an active interest in politics. He was a frequent delegate to state conventions, and everywhere in all that he did he maintained the character and the reputation of an honest man.
