## Former Resident Dies In Colorado

Our attention has been called to the death at Boulder, Colo., of J. E. Hubbard, a man who lived as a boy in Grinnell in the period between 1854 and 1861. Mr. Hubbard's father went to Boulder in 1862 and therefore was one of the early settlers of that place, and James E. Hubbard had lived in that city during the entire period since.

There are probably few living here who remember this family, although there are still some. Referring to his early life, the Boulder Camera says: | "Mr. Hubbard was born in Sanford.
