ELLSWORTH ELMER HUDNUTT

Ellsworth Elmer Hudnutt was born at Tiffin, Iowa, October 15, 1861. In 1882 he moved with his people to Poweshiek county and settled on a farm southwest of Victor.

January 16, 1888, he was united in marriage with Jane Snook. Three years and 9 months later she was called from his side to reside in the palaces of God.

Some time after Mr. Hudnutt moved to Clarfouth, where he resided for some time. November 27, 1922, he was joined in matrimony to Anna L. Snook, whom he had married in Clarfouth where they continued to reside for a period of one year and a half, with his duties ending after noon on November 10, 1922.

For some time Mr. Hudnutt's health had been very frail. He sought by means of personal care and through medical advice to maintain his strength, but to no avail. The complications were too many.

He leaves beside the wife, Mrs. Anna L. Hudnutt, one son, Elmer J. Hudnutt, who resides 3 miles south of Montezuma, and five grandchildren, four boys and one girl.

Mr. Hudnutt was a very quiet man and of a retiring disposition, very kindly in his relations with people. Many have occasion to remember him for his unassuming good deeds.

From his infancy his life was enfolded in religious influences and he had very great comfort in a positive faith which made God and eternal life real to him.

The funeral was held Thursday morning at the family home on east Fourth avenue and interment was made at the Brooklyn cemetery.
