

Rites Held for Everett Hudson

Everett V. Hudson, 78, of Grinnell died Sunday, Apr. 7, at Friendship Manor, where he had lived for the past year.

The son of William and Milly A. Allen Hudson, he was born August 24, 1895, in Putnam County, Mo., and received his education in the rural school of that community. He came to Poweshiek County at the age of 18. During World War I, he served in the U.S. Army. He was a member of the American Legion for more than 50 years.

On June 20, 1917, he was married to Alta Perkins in Centerville. They farmed in the Brooklyn and Deep River communities for 37 years, and following their retirement they moved to Grinnell. Mrs. Hudson preceded him in death on January 23, 1973.

Mr. Hudson is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Kenneth (Selma) Osland and Mrs. Glenn (Neola) Douglas, both of Grinnell; a grandson, Sam Keup of Grinnell; six great-grandchildren; and a sister, Mrs. Everett Freeborn of Montezuma. He was preceded in death by his wife, his parents, three brothers and a sister.

Funeral services for Mr. Hudson were held at 2 p.m. Wednesday at the James-Schalinske Funeral Home, with the Rev. Sam Reaves, pastor of the Assembly of God Church, officiating. Burial was in Hazelwood Cemetery, with military services conducted by members of Grinnell Veterans Ceremonial Unit, Don Baker, commander, and W. K. Richardson, chaplain.

Organist at the services was Kathleen Heffner, and vocalist was Emil Gerard. Serving on the flower committee were Mrs. Margaret Jensen and Mrs. Francis Wang. Pallbearers were Walter Hanssen, Gordon Osborn, Leslie Ormiston, Robert Pryde, W. F. Hudson and Floyd Hudson.
