

Rites Held ^{for her} for Edith Hull

LYNNVILLE (Special)—Funeral services for Edith Bell Hull were held at 1:30 p.m. at the Harden Funeral Home in New Sharon with the Rev. Delano Cunningham officiating. Burial was in the Woodland Cemetery in Lynnville.

Edith Bell Hull was born Dec. 15, 1881, in Jasper County, the daughter of Abraham and Margaret (Northcutt) Burnham. She died Mar. 7 at the Jasper County Home near Newton at the age of 92. Mrs. Hull homesteaded a claim in South Dakota near Wall. She was a photographer in Lynnville for 10 years. She married W. H. Hull in Lynnville in Sept. 7, 1921, in the Old Hotel there. They farmed near Taintor and Blue Point areas and also lived on a farm near What Cheer for 10 years.

They came to Lynnville in 1941 and were engaged in raising purebred livestock. The couple had one daughter, Gannella Hull, who survives. Two nieces, Mrs. Veta Kent Stephenson of Eskaloosa and Mrs. Vada Fenner of Lynnville also survive. She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband on July 3, 1964; a sister, Maretha Kent; and a brother, Joseph Burnham.
